
In the past few months, we have sent out early-bird invoices for 2016 new and renewing memberships with a few changes:

Ms. LaDonna Drury-Klein RDA, BS, is recognized for her commitment and dedication to the dental assisting profession serving as the first Executive Director (ED) of CADAT from 2009 through 2015. Prior to her appointment as ED, she was a member for nearly 26 years, who served as association President and a volunteer leader. She has been an entrepreneur for dental services and a dedicated speaker focused on OSHA, Infection Control and California Dental Practice Act as well as writing regulations and statutes supporting education and the dental assisting profession in California.

During her 18 years of clinical dentistry, she earned degrees in biological sciences and business management and worked over 20 years as a dental educator, speaker and trainer for all dental professionals. Ms. Drury-Klein served as a two-time appointee to the Dental Board of California under Governor Gray Davis and is often called upon as a subject matter expert to assist in developing regulatory and statutory language for dental assisting-related oversight. In 2011, she established the Foundation for Allied Dental Education (FADE) as a non-profit, public benefit organization targeted on supporting the educational and professional development needs of all allied dental healthcare personnel and as a collaborative supporter of CADAT.

LaDonna has focused much of her attention toward authoring textbooks and preparation resources for state and national dental assisting examinations, infection control and compliance manuals. She is always there to lend a helping hand whether it be to answer member questions, design a special CADAT pin, run a conference or event, write a regulation or compliance manual, network with others or pick-out a perfect meal and glass of wine.

We will forever be grateful for her years of service as the Executive Director of CADAT and her artistic talent, mentorship, and friendship. 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#### Legislative Update

As noted in our last report, much has changed with respect to the Sunset Review Committee's response to the Dental Board's handling of the RDA practical examination. AB178 (Bonilla/Hill) was amended to remove the urgency clause regarding the RDA practical moratorium and all language pertaining to how the examination shall be assessed for future applicability was moved into the reauthorization Bill for the Dental Board, AB179 (Bonilla).

As it relates to the RDA practical examination, the strong John Valencia, Legislative opinion and early decision-making by the two Chairs of

the Sunset Review Committee (Bonilla and Hill) to set aside the practical softened to allow the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs to insist that the Bill include a provision allowing the Dental Board to determine whether or not the examination is a worthy process to continue administering. In simultaneous fashion, the examinations have suddenly resulted in higher pass rates, more progressive and positive communication and handling of candidates at the examination sites, and overall improved performance by all engaged in the process.

The language of AB179 preserves, to some degree, the practical examination for as long as the Board chooses; however, those who spoke out against the moratorium on the practical may now be faced with the new consequences. As we see this language, should the Board choose to eliminate, suspend or change the practical for any length of time, and for any reason, including the outcome of the occupational analysis, the licensure process in total may be affected. Given that current law requires <u>three examinations be passed in order to become licensed</u>, the Bill carried no provision to amend existing law allowing for the Board to continue issuing RDA licenses should the practical be suspended or removed, thus creating a consequence that, whether intended or not, could impact licensing of dental assistants.

Our collaborative team of advocates wish to thank all those members who supported our initiatives and the students who came forward to highlight the issues with the RDA practical examination over the past year. Your efforts did exactly what was needed - create an environment of change and make the Board accountable to a higher authority going forward. With legislative and DCA watchdogs asking for continued accountability, we will hopefully see continued trends upward with the examination stats and encourage all members of CADAT to support your representatives as they continue to work for you and your students.

This coming year, attendees will engage in the following activities in Manhattan Beach:


- Friday, April 22: all day CE event featuring topics involving restorative dentistry, oral cancers, new polishing techniques and aspects of dental practice regulations

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
### CADAT Educators Requested for Conference Roundtables
