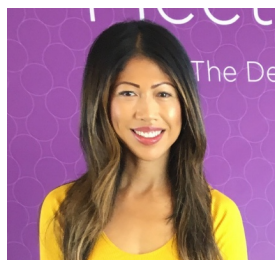

We will look at the process of scanning, designing and manufacturing a restoration, how it is utilized in the dental office and dental lab along with the materials used in CAD/CAM dentistry. We will also compare CAD/CAM to the traditional restorative techniques.</p> <p>Sleep and Airway – The Role of the Dental Professional The presentation will touch on what Obstructive Sleep Apnea is, its pathophysiology and the interrelationship of Airway disorders with OSA. We will discuss how we as Dental Professionals can help identify patients who could have OSA (including children) and guide them into getting intervention.</p>
